

Badenhorst, 22, was arrested for the act.

After the trial yesterday, Devine said, "He did give a statement to the police of his involvement." He said it is also on the 9-1-1 tape.

Devine said he wants to talk to the pathologist as the extent of the blows before the state rules out the death penalty.

Tungate said she was appointing attorney Ron Boyer to Badenhorst's case.

"He is the only attorney who is capital certified," she said. She said if for some reason Boyer could not, or would not, take his case, an attorney from outside the county would be appointed. "He (Boyer) has the opportunity to deny (taking the case)," she said.

Badenhorst will have an appearance of counsel at 9:30 a.m. Thursday.
